

Increasing competition for port infrastructure




Port and terminal customers increasingly demand additional services on top of traditional transport and logistics solutions






With COVID19, uncertainty on medium term development has strongly increased



Broader approach is key to maintaining and developing position of ports in the supply chain




Digital technologies bring opportunities and threats
