



- Largest port on the Black Sea 3,926 ha

Rhine-Danube Core Network Corridor

- Connection through the Danube Black Sea Canal
- The Canal is 64.4 km long and 90 m wide and has a water depth of 7 m and 17.5 m clearance under the bridges









Pan-European Corridor no. IV (road and railway)

- •Connection through the A2 Highway Bucureşti-Constanța
- Direct port connection with the A2 Highway close to the northern side of the Danube-Black Sea Canal









Pan-European Corridor no. IX (railway)

- Corridor links: Helsinki Vyborg St. Petersburg Pskov
- Moscow Kaliningrad Kiev Ljubashevka/Rozdilna Chisinau – Bucharest – Giurgiu – Dimitrovgrad
- Connection is made through the national railway network

- For goods in transit from the Far East to destinations in Central Europe the connection Danube River Constanța Port offers a maritime transport alternative which is by 4,165 km shorter than the traditional routes to the Western Europe ports through the Mediterranean Sea
- Largest port in Black Sea, with natural depths that can accommodate the largest ships (300 meters) passing through the Bosphorus Strait.


















CEREAL HUB FOR CENTRAL AND EASTERN EUROPE




- Port of Constanța, a cereal hub on the Black Sea.

- Modern equipment and facilities for loading and unloading river and maritime ships.








CONTAINER THROUGHPUT 2009-2014

- Total area 76 ha (52 ha operational)

New Master Plan for Port of Constanța

GENERAL OBJECTIVE:

Ensuring conditions for a growing efficient maritime transport system through:

- enhancement of the port infrastructure and efficiency of port operations leading to an increase in attractiveness for port users and a greater number of vessels calling at Romania Maritime and Danube Ports;
- preparing the future project portfolio.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE:

Setting up the necessary framework to promote the development of Constantza maritime port for the period 2014-2030, through optimal planning of investments in transport infrastructure.

EXPECTED RESULTS:

- Diagnostic analysis of existing situation;
- Variants of strategies;
- Master Plan on short, medium and long term;
- Development Strategy for Constanța Port.








Extension by 1,050 m of North Breakwater

-Estimated Value: about 144 mil. Euro

-Financing sources: SOP-T 2007-2013/EU structural funds (85 %) and state budget (15%)

-Works in progress by Van Oord BV – Deadline end of 2015

- The purpose of the project is to improve the operations conditions inside port, by decreasing wave stirring in the south port basins, improving navigation safety.









Road bridge across the Danube-Black Sea Canal 0+540

- -Estimated value of the project: about 43 million Euro.
- -Financing sources: SOP-T 2007-2013/EU structural funds (85%) and state budget (15%).
- The project creates a direct connection to the Bucharest-Constanța highway through the ringroad of Constanța City and at the same time sets up a link between the North and South areas of the port.
- -Deadline summer of 2015.









Development of the railway capacity in the river-maritime area of Constanța Port

- Estimated value: about 22 million Euro
- Structural funds (85%) and state budget (15%).
- The project consists of completing a systematized rail complex in the rivermaritime sector of Constanța Port, that will assure efficient railway services for existing and new port operators.
- Deadline 2015.










FUTURE PROJECTS



Bridge over the connection canal in the river-maritime area

- -Estimated value: about 36 mil. Euro
- -Status: Feasibility Study designed by SC IPTANA SA .
- -Financing sources: state budget/other eligible sources.

Systematization of the artificial island

- -Estimated value: about 300 mil. Euro.
- -Status: Feasibility Study designed by SC IPTANA SA.
- -Financing sources: state budget or other eligible sources.









Construction of Pier IIIS and Pier IVS infrastructure



- -The study project is executed by the Dutch Government through the European Gateways Project.
- -New terminals in the Port of Constanța will be developed for the handling and storage of cargoes in the south area of the port adjacent to the existing DPW container terminal on the locations, known as Pier 3S and Pier 4S.
- -Design concepts will be developed for the new specialized terminals and logistics park, in accordance with the new Master Plan.
- -Possible financing sources: concession of works, PPP, or other eligible sources.







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
