STRATEGIC GUIDANCE



Logistics Processes and Motorways of the Sea II project, funded by the European Union, has become a long-term guideline for the development of the corridor

Master Plan

It includes a set of recommendations on policies, goals, system needs, and priorities that guide decision-making.

50% of the recommendations are based on EU support

Provides for the upgrade of port facilities on the Caspian Sea (incl. Aktau)

Strategy for 2016-2026

Master Plan, adopted on June 1, 2016, at the 12th Annual IGC Meeting in Odessa, is an annex to the IGC Strategy and an integral part of it.

Action Plan for 2022-2026

Adopted at the 15th Annual Meeting of the IGC TRACECA in Sofia, Republic of Bulgaria.

Several measures are directly related to the port activity (direction 3. Motorways of the Sea, railway-ferry communication and maritime routes)

Key highlights from the Action Plan for implementing Kazakhstan's Concept for the Development of Transport and Logistics Potential until 2030:

Construction of a new Container Hub

- Phase 1 to be completed by the end of this year
- Full operational capacity: up to 200,000 TEU per year

Implementation of a Vessel Traffic Management System (VTMS)

- To be introduced in Aktau by the end of 2025
- Subsequent integration with VTMS of Kuryk and Bautino
- Establishment of a unified control centre in Aktau

- ensuring the legal force of electronic documents and signatures.


