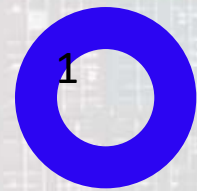

Greening and Empowering the Maritime Future



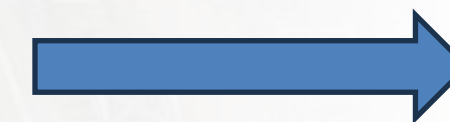
- Integrate green port practices: renewable energy, cleaner tech.
